The Rainbow Palette Club organized a vibrant and creative event on Rangoli and Mehendi competition on 25th August 2023.





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Educational Visit to Kautilya Museum of Accountancy

Date of Visit: 7th March 2023

On 7th March 2023, the first-year Division Four students of H L College of Commerce visited the Kautilya Museum of Accountancy, located at the School of Commerce, Gujarat University. This unique museum, dedicated to the rich history and evolution of accountancy, provided the students with an invaluable opportunity to explore the journey of accountancy from its ancient origins to its modern-day applications.

Museum Overview:

The museum's first section took students on a historical journey, starting with the mention of accountancy in Indian mythology, where Chitra Gupta was believed to record the good and bad deeds of individuals. The evolution of accounting practices was then traced, beginning with the token accounting system in Mesopotamia, where accountants were referred to as scribes. Students learned about the development of accounting instruments—from symbols and tokens to the quipu, abacus, and the double-entry system introduced by Luca Pacioli, an Italian mathematician often regarded as the "Father of Accountancy." The museum also highlighted the significant contributions of Chanakya's Arthashastra to the field of accountancy and described India's early development of the Desi Nama accounting system before the 13th century. The museum further delved into the evolution of cost accounting and management accounting, culminating in the contemporary use of software like Tally Prime and ERP-9. A forward-looking discussion also explored the potential integration of artificial intelligence in accounting practices.

Artifacts and Impactful Figures:

The museum housed artificial replicas and miniatures of ancient accounting tools, including clay symbols, tokens, envelopes, quipu, abacuses, and more. A notable section honored individuals who made significant contributions to the field of accountancy, such as Mary Harris (the world's first female Chartered Accountant), R. Shivabhogam (India's first Chartered Accountant), and Luca Pacioli. Another section focused on pivotal books and journals that have shaped the field, including *Postulates of Accounting*, Cost Accounting, and journals like The Accountant and The Accounting Review. Additionally, the museum provided a detailed montage of major accountancy frauds, including the infamous Satyam scam, offering important lessons on ethics in the field.

Dedicated Sections:

Two sections of the museum were dedicated to the monumental contributions of two individuals. The first honored Chanakya (Kautilya), whose Arthashastra continues to influence modern accounting practices.

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The museum is named in his honor to commemorate his significant legacy. The second section was dedicated to Donaldson Brown, renowned for his contributions to managerial accounting, particularly his development of a modern managerial control system and his famous formula, R = TxP.

Evolution of Accounting as a Profession:

One of the key sections explored the development of accountancy as a profession, tracing its origins to 400 BCE and its continuous evolution. It was also noted that the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) was established in 1949, followed by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India (ICSI) in 1968.

Government and Regulatory Bodies:

The museum also provided insight into various government and regulatory bodies related to accountancy, including the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA), Indian Institute of Chartered Accountants (ICAI), Institute of Cost Accountants of India (ICMAI), and the Serious Fraud Investigation Office (SFIO). It also mentioned quasi-judicial bodies such as the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) and the Competition Commission of India (CCI), among others.

Auditing Evolution:

The final section of the museum focused on the evolution of auditing practices, providing a comprehensive understanding of how auditing has shaped the accounting profession over time.





Conclusion:

The visit to the Kautilya Museum of Accountancy was both insightful and enriching for the students of H L College of Commerce. The museum offered a fascinating glimpse into the history, evolution, and future of accountancy, enhancing students' understanding of the subject's importance and its role in both historical and modern contexts. The School of Commerce at Gujarat University was an excellent host, and this educational visit proved to be a memorable and surreal experience, allowing students to deeply connect with the field of accountancy.
